

# Pocket Tissue Pack

Note: This is for Kleenex pocket tissues. Adjust for different brands.

## Here's what you need:

- 1 piece of main fabric measuring  $6\frac{3}{4}$ " x  $7\frac{1}{2}$ "
- 1 piece of lining fabric measuring  $6\frac{3}{4}$ " x  $7\frac{1}{2}$ "
- Pocket tissues or a few sweet vintage hankies
- Pins
- Chopstick or knitting needle
- Scissors
- Thread
- Iron



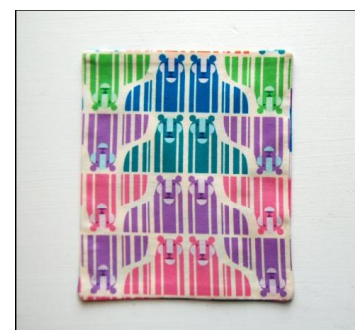
## Instructions

1. Place the main and lining fabrics right sides together. Pin.



2. Stitch around the entire piece using a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam (I use the width of the foot). leaving a  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " opening for turning on the  $7\frac{1}{2}$ " side that is 1" from the edge. Clip the corners.

3. Turn right side out. Press into the corners with a chopstick or knitting needle. Press.





3. With the right side facing up, fold in half making short ends touch each other. Press or finger press to mark the centerline, then unfold.

4. Fold the bottom  $6\frac{3}{4}$ " end up  $\frac{1}{4}$ " past the center line. Then fold the  $6\frac{3}{4}$ " short end down  $\frac{1}{4}$ " past the center line. Pin both ends.



5. Stitch each of the sides closed, and be sure to backstitch at the beginning and end. Stitch as close to the edge as you can.

6. Turn right side out and press into the corners with a chopstick or knitting needle.

7. Fill with pocket tissues or a few vintage hankies.  
You're done!



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
